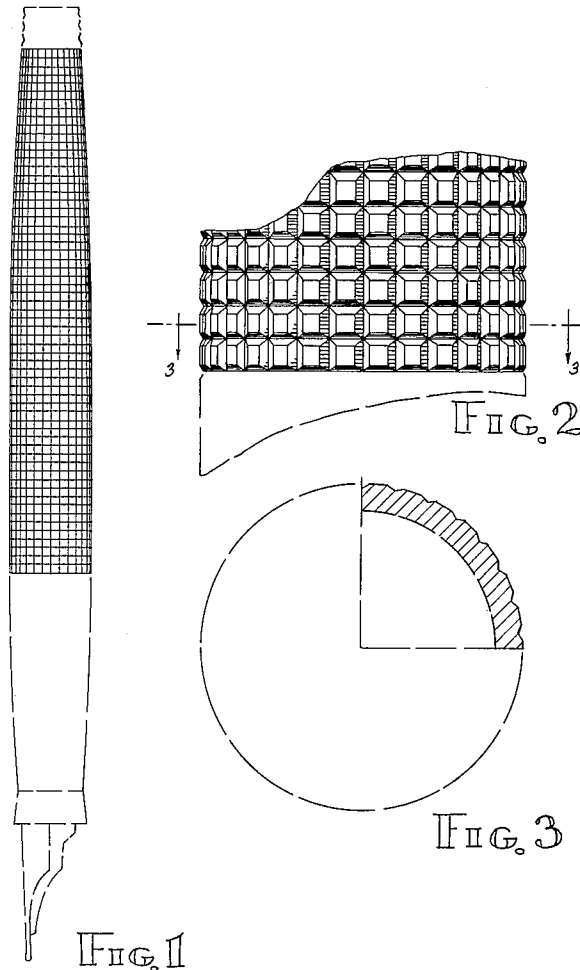


FIGURE 1 is a side elevational view of a writing instrument, showing my new design, the side opposite there-to being similar in appearance.

FIGURE 2 is an enlarged fragmentary side elevational view of the writing instrument of FIGURE 1; and

FIGURE 3 is a fragmentary sectional view taken on line 3—3 of FIGURE 2.

The characterizing features of my writing instrument design, as shown in solid lines in the drawing, reside in the combination of longitudinal and circumferential V-grooves on an elongate tubular barrel member, said V-grooves crossing substantially at right angles to define a plurality of generally square figures having a beveled edge at each defining side.

I claim:

The ornamental design for a writing instrument, substantially as shown and described.
