


To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John C. Wahl, a citizen of the United States, residing at Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, and whose post-office address is 1800 Roscoe street, Chicago, Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Pen or Pencil Cases, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part thereof.

Referring to the figures:

Figure 1 is a perspective view of the well-known Eversharp pencil ornamented with

my new design on the circumference of the pencil case, and

Fig. 2 is a view of my new design, de-

veloped on a plane.

The particular figures upon the pencil are set forth prominently by a line forming the outside border of the individual figures and thence by engine turning the barrel about the figures and leaving that portion of the surface inclosed within the line smooth.

I claim:

The original design for a pen or pencil case as shown.
