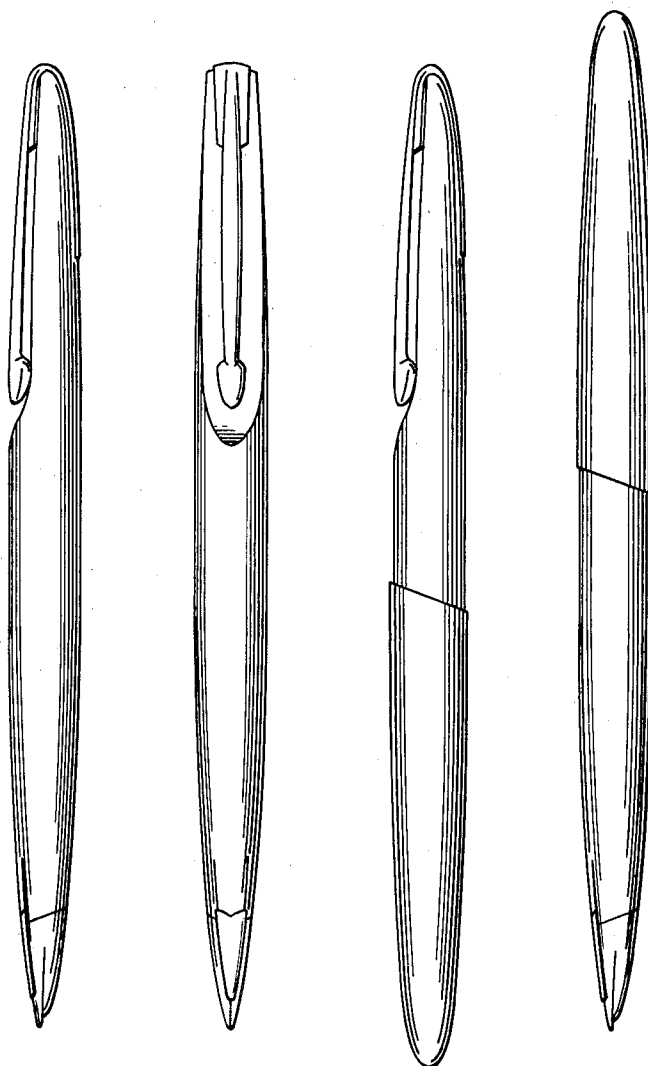

Fig. 5 is a rear elevational view of the pen shown in Fig. 1.
